Metaphor: Hidden comparison of two unlike things not using "like" or "as".

Example: Ali is a lion! (Ali is fierce and brave like a lion. Unless Ali is an animal which lives in the zoo and goes by the name Ali, this is not a literal but a metaphorical statement.)

Analogy: An analogy is a literary device that helps to establish a relationship based on similarities between two

Form

Allusion: An allusion is an indirect reference to a person, place, event, or artistic work.

Allusions assume a level of familiarity on the part of the reader with the work, person or event referenced.



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



Simile: A comparison of 2 different things or ideas through the use of the word "LIKE, AS"
 { she acts like a lady
 { She is as beautiful as a rose.

Pun: Pun is a play on words, usually for a comic reception.

Euphemism: is an inoffensive or indirect expression that is substituted for one that is considered offensive or too harsh. (Yumuşatıcı söyleme)
 { You aren't poor, you are economically disadvantaged.

Metonymy → US Presidency → White house

Turkish state republic's old presidency → Çankaya Köşkü

Irony: The butter is as soft as a marble piece.
