- Kyoto, Japan, has over 1600 temples.
- There are over 2300 recognized languages in Asia. However, Mandarin Chinese is the most widely spoken language in the continent and the world, with 918 million native speakers.
- Chopsticks, one of the world's oldest utensils, are still in use after 3,000 years. The chopstick, which originated in China, is steeped in folklore. Eating with a chopstick is said to engage approximately 50 muscles, including those of the hand, face, and neck.



Did you know?

- Despite having only 12 sovereign countries, South America has one of the most linguistically diverse areas in the world, with approximately 450 recorded languages.
- Football arrived in South America in the nineteenth century via the port of Buenos Aires, Argentina, where European sailors played the sport.
- Milk is not typically consumed as a beverage, but it is used in fruit drinks and coffee, and milk-based desserts are popular. Fruits, vegetables, and nuts are consumed in large quantities. Cassava flour and meal are widely available in many areas.

- The oldest known human remains have all been discovered in east African sites. Human remains discovered in Ethiopia date back at least 200,000 years.
